



Manager's Report

The First Quarter at the Lodge has been exciting, challenging, and rewarding. There are many things that have been accomplished in the last few months. Some of those items include: continuing renovations in rooms, new screening at the Bad Rabbit Café, landscaping around the lodge, and the pond.

As always happens in any business, there are constant updates, upgrades, and replacement items that must be tended to. Here at the ranch, attention has been given to the pool (new pumps and filters); well; office (new flooring); café (new screens, venthoods, grill) Bunk House (doors, electrical); Bath house (handicap rails); vehicles; and many other items too numerous to mention.

The non-potable well seems to be keeping up better since a new float switch was installed along with a new pump tech. Water is being restricted to a maximum of 5,000 gallons per day and 500 gallons per person per day. Restrictions will not be lifted until there is some more rain.

There has been much needed mechanical attention given to the fleet of vehicles we depend on to get our work done. Some have been sold, others have been used for parts, and others have been fixed.

Preparation for the audit in June was also part of the workload. Many documents needed to be gathered to prepare for that.

Work and attention has gone into working with Property Owners and bringing their accounts current. There have been several accounts go into good standing in the last few months.

There will likely be another auction in September. We are working at the various properties that could be listed.

Due to an illness in the family, Carole Dahl will not be returning to her position in Property Services. The position is being posted on the website.

New rack cards have been printed and are being distributed in feeder cities in the area, including the Alpine Chamber.

Two Western Cedar frames have been made for the Christmas Mountains maps that were donated by TSUS.

Discounts for Lodging

Effective March 1, 2016 the following discount policy will apply:

- A. Members in Good Standing are eligible for a 20% discount on rooms reserved at Terlingua Ranch Lodge. This discount applies only to spouses and dependent children residing with the members in good standing. TSUS, corporations and/or partnerships will also be eligible for the discount for themselves and their spouses and dependent children residing with the employee/partner.
- B. Groups paying for a minimum of 4 rooms (a quad) are eligible for a 25% discount per room per night.
- C. Senior Citizens (62 or older), military members (active and veterans), and students are eligible for a 10% discount. Proof of eligibility must be provided at check-in.
- D. An off-season discount may be implemented at the discretion of the Ranch Manager during the months of June, July and/or August.
- E. Discounts may not be combined.
- F. Recommendations on room rates and discounts will be reviewed annually in March for a May 1 effective date. Room rates and/or discounts will be amended as necessary to maintain the overall ability of the lodge including the facilities, amenities, and services offered to be self-supporting.
